Job Site Requirements for Prefinished Hardwood Floor Installation

We strongly recommend that our handcrafted, prefinished French Oak hardwood floors be installed at the final stage of construction, alongside carpet installation.

To ensure optimal results, the wood floor should be acclimated for a minimum of 10 days in stable living conditions, rather than the unstable conditions typically found during construction. Proper timing of installation is essential to prevent costly repairs or replacements and is critical to achieving a successful outcome and ensuring total customer satisfaction.

Before your floor can be delivered and installed, the following requirements must be met:

The central HVAC system (furnace and a/c) must be on and running for a minimum
of 30 days
All wet setting work that includes dry wall installation, taping, priming, painting,
tile, stone, etc. – must be completed minimum 2 weeks prior
All walls are primed and painted
All spray painting is completed
All trim work is completed and painted
Kitchen cabinets are installed on ¾" plywood or Signature provided wood floor
blocks.
Built-in cabinet work is completed
Baseboards are installed and painted (base shoe to be installed after the wood
floor)
RH Factor (Relative Humidity) in the residence must be between 35% and 50%
Plywood subfloor MC (Moisture Content) must be between 8% and 10%
Plywood subfloor must be dry, clean and free of construction debris, dirt and
residue
You must have a designated area in the house for hardwood floor storage during
acclimation

If contacted, our delivery team will unload and distribute your new hardwood floor materials throughout the residence. However, they will require guidance regarding the designated locations for storing the materials to ensure proper acclimation and prevent any potential damage.
