### 3. Installation Instructions

#### **Materials Needed:**

- Rug
- Rug pad (DuraHold® preferred)
- Scissors or utility knife (if pad trimming is necessary)
- Measuring tape
- Vacuum or broom

#### Steps:

#### 1. Clean the Floor

Sweep or vacuum the hardwood area where the rug will be placed. Ensure the surface is dry and free of dust and debris.

#### 2. Measure and Trim the Pad

Lay the rug pad in place and trim it if necessary. The pad should be approximately **1–2 inches smaller than the rug on all sides** to avoid visible edges and promote safe tapering at the rug's border.

### 3. Position the Pad

Place the rug pad on the floor, rubber side down (gripping side), and smooth out any wrinkles.

#### 4. Lay the Rug

Center your rug over the pad. Adjust it so it aligns properly within your space. Ensure all corners and edges are flat and secure.

# 5. Final Touch

Walk across the rug to help it settle into place. Check corners and adjust alignment if needed.
